

1. Administrations Responsibility

- 1.1. The Authority for Info-communications Technology Industry of Brunei Darussalam (AITI) is the Administrator¹ in assigning and administering the ISPC. According to clause 9.5, ITU-T recommendation Q.708 of the 'Assignment procedures for international signaling point codes'.
- 1.2. AITI will notify ITU of ISPCs allocation/ withdrawal to/ from any operator. The codes will be allocated in a period not more than 90 days from the date of receipt of an application for ISPC. This period may be exceeded where:
 - 1.2.1. Additional information is required from the operator
 - 1.2.2. AITI considers that an alternative period of time is required; upon which AITI notify the applicant in writing.

2. Assignment of ISPC

- 2.1. Operators do not have any ownership rights over any signaling point code allocated to them.
- 2.2. An ISPC derived from a SANC assigned to AITI must be used within Brunei Darussalam.
- 2.3. An ISPC assigned to an Operator is non-transferrable between signaling point operators. ISPCs may not be sold, licensed or traded by signaling point operators. ISPCs may not be transferred except in the case of a merger, acquisition, divestiture, or joint venture. The signaling point shall notify AITI of any such transfer.
- 2.4. The signaling point operator has to put into service or is about to put into service signaling point having at least one MTP signaling relation in the international signaling network.
- 2.5. The signaling point operator shall to comply with relevant ITU-T Recommendations such as ITU-T Recommendation Q.708.
- 2.6. Signaling Point Operator shall provide AITI with the information required by filling in the form in ANNEX 1 of this document.
- 2.7. Signaling Point Operator shall confirm that the requested ISPC shall be placed in service within 12 months from the date of assignment.
- 2.8. Signaling Point Operator shall notify AITI of any changes in details of ISPC assigned.

¹ The term "Administrator" is to be used hereafter to indicate a Member State's/ Administration's designated Administrator for the purpose of requesting SANCs or assigning ISPCs.

3. Withdrawal of assigned International Signal Point Code

3.1. AITI may withdraw an assigned ISPC in the following cases:-

3.1.1. ISPC assigned to operator is being used in a different way from that for which it was allocated

3.1.2. Resource is being used by a signaling point operator other than the one to whom the ISPC was assigned.

3.1.3. Assigned ISPC is no longer in use or required by the signaling point operator.

3.2. ISPC which has been withdrawn shall have an aging period of six months before it is available for reassignment.
